General Questions

- What is this kit?
 - Our Grow-It-Together Garden Kit is a complimentary kit containing a hydroponic garden and all the materials and step-by-step instructions you need to grow your own herbs and leafy greens. This is a one-off kit, not a subscription.
- Are the kits really free?
 - All of our programs are complimentary. Mather is a not-for-profit with a mission of creating Ways to Age Well,SM which includes providing this program free of charge.
- Why did I receive this kit?
 - You (or perhaps a friend or family member) registered for this kit by entering your email address and mailing address on our website, here. You may have found us through one of our other programs, through a friend or family member, or through our ads on the internet and social media.
- What information do you collect?
 - We ask for your name, email address, phone number, and mailing address upon registration. We do not share your information with other organizations.

- What type of supplies are in each kit?
 - Your kit contains a hydroponic garden and all the materials and step-by-step instructions you need to grow your own herbs and leafy greens, including seeds and plant nutrients.
- Are the Zoom Garden Club sessions mandatory?
 - The Zoom sessions are not mandatory—although we think they're a lot of fun, and a great opportunity to ask questions and connect to others! We know not everyone's schedule allows for the monthly Zoom sessions at the time provided, which is why this program also includes video recordings and illustrated tip sheets.

- What will I need to provide?
 - You will need to water your garden and keep it plugged in. Everything else you need will be included in your kit.
- Is this kit accessible for different levels of experience and ability?
 - This kit is designed for accessibility across different levels of dexterity, and we welcome everyone, from beginners to practiced gardeners. We use Zoom with closed captions available. - How should I prepare for the garden?
 - The tip sheets and videos included with this kit will have detailed information on how to set up your garden. You'll want to make sure you place your garden in a space where you can easily plug it into an electrical outlet and conveniently access water. Make sure not to place your garden under a cabinet with other lighting – you'll want space to raise the lid of the garden, and limited competing lighting above the garden.
